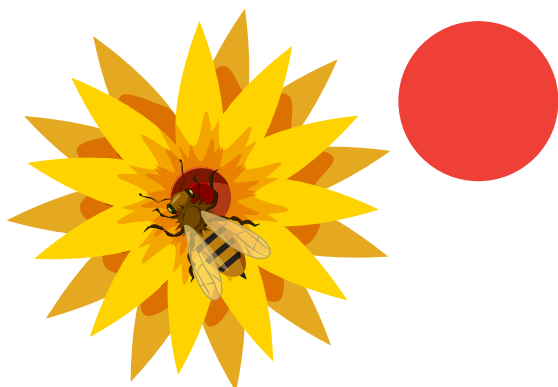




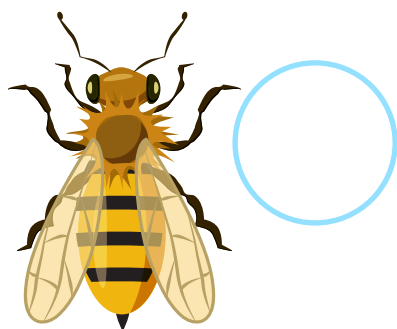
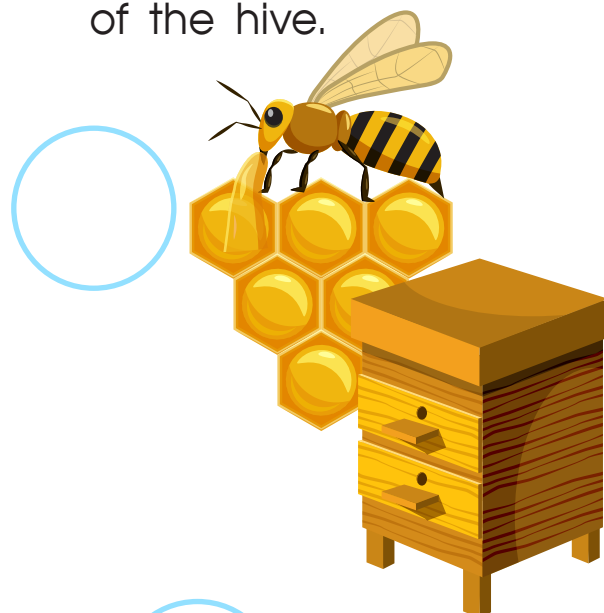
# How Bees Make Honey

Draw a line through the white circles next to the pictures to put the process of making honey in the correct order. You should start at the red circle.

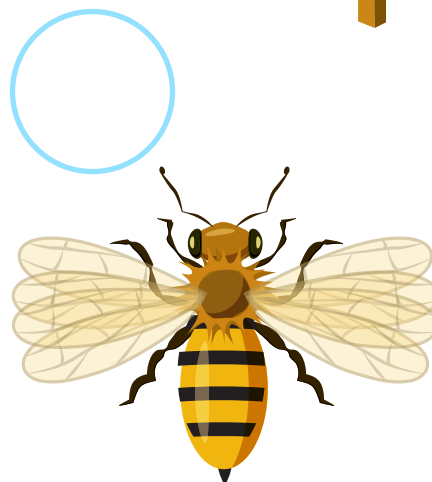
The honey bees use their tongues to suck up the nectar from flowers.



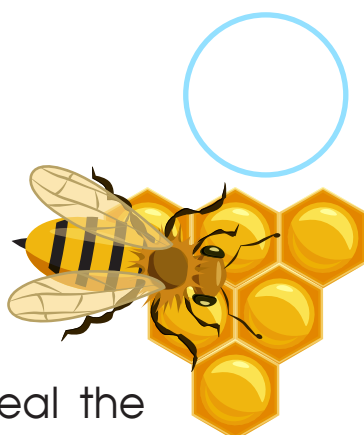
The bees move the honey mix into the honeycombs of the hive.



The bee's body turns nectar into sugar.



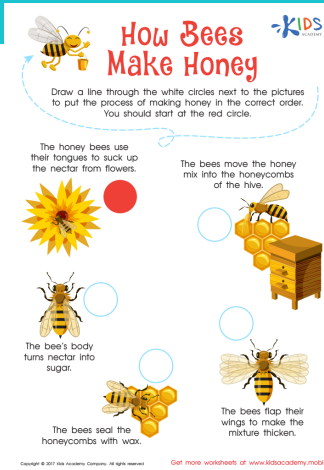
The bees flap their wings to make the mixture thicken.
