



Pirate Punctuation:

Question and Quotation Marks

The question mark goes **inside** the quotation marks if the quotation is a question.

For example: The pirate asked: "What did you see?"

The question mark goes **outside** if the whole sentence is a question, but the quotation is not.

For example: Did you say, "This is a pirate ship"?


